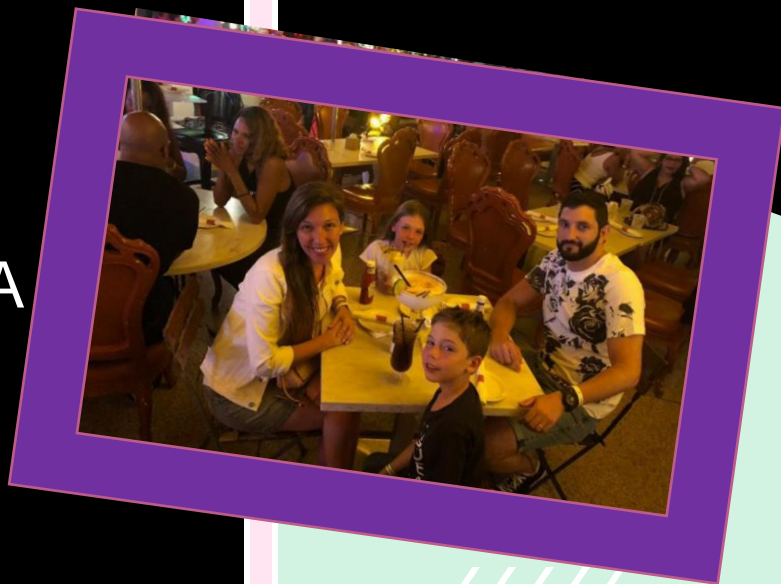




MY FAMILY'S PAST VS NOW A DAYS

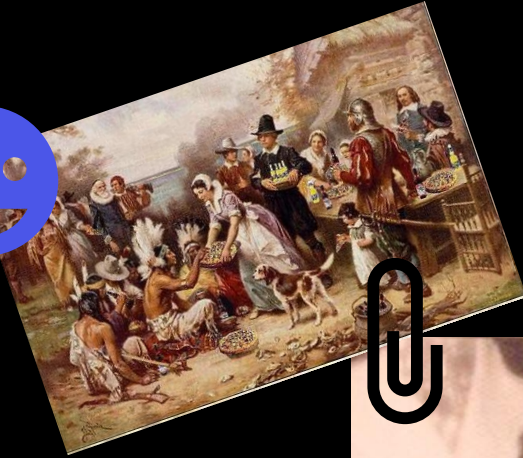
The main idea of this scrapbook is to understand how the colonial period defines our culture now a days. Also , to see how my family ´s past has an effect on myself and my family.

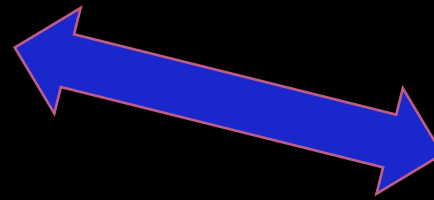
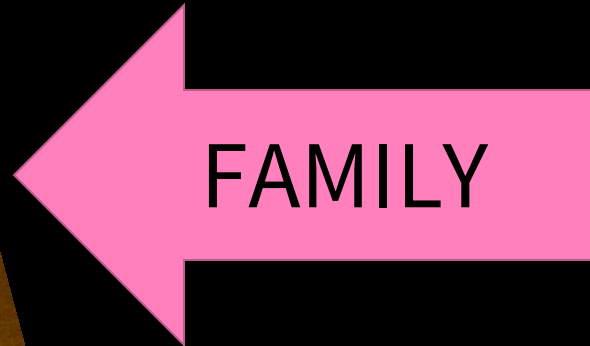
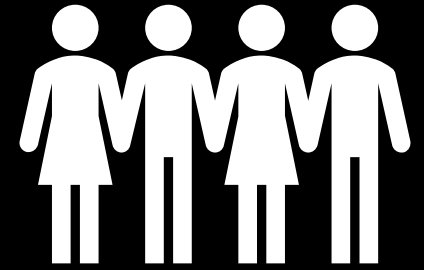
